Would you like to earn a Masters of Clinical Science (MCISc) and receive advanced standing for your manual and manipulative therapy courses?

The University of Western Ontario, School of Physical Therapy offers the first distance learning program for FCAMPTs in Canada.

The program is designed to foster professional and research competencies. Those who are registered fellows of CAMPT are given credit for their prior manual and manipulative therapy courses and are required to complete 2 on-line courses: Research Methods and Knowledge Exchange (PT9600), Advanced Professional Practice (PT9610), and a group Supervised Research Experience (PT9630).

Faculty members contributing to the research program include: Bert Chesworth, PT PhD, Dave Walton, PT PhD FCAMPT and Trevor Birmingham, PT PhD, Canada Research Chair in Musculoskeletal Rehabilitation and Dianne Bryant, PhD.
